### **Swimming**

As part of the National Curriculum schools must provide swimming and water safety lessons either in key stage 1 or key stage 2. National curriculum requirements are pupils should be taught to: • swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres • use a range of strokes effectively (for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke) • perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations Within this form, we ask that schools provide data on the percentage of pupils within its year 6 cohort in the current academic year who met the national curriculum swimming and water safety requirements. Schools should provide attainment data for year 6 pupils from their most recent swimming lessons. This may be data from previous years, depending on the swimming and water safety programme at the school.
