# **Forest School and Cookery**

#### **Year 3 Music**

#### **Banned Items**

We often get queries about which items are and are not allowed in school. Generally, if a child does not need a particular item for school, please do not allow your child to bring it in. There are of course, particular items which must *not* be brought to school under any circumstance. For full details, please refer to Appendix 5 of our Relational Behaviour Policy on the school website but as an overview, the following items are not permitted to be brought into school: • knives and weapons • alcohol • illegal drugs • stolen items • vapes, tobacco or cigarette papers • fireworks • air tags/tracking devices • pornographic images • any article that has been or is likely to be used to commit an offence, cause personal injury or damage to property.

Although mobile phones *can* be brought into school, we would strongly discourage this. If they are needed, they **must** be handed in at the start of the school day. They will then be returned to the pupil at the end of the day. Mobile phones must not be left on, used or seen on site, other than when being handed in or collected. Please ensure that your child knows *how* to switch off their mobile phone if they absolutely must bring it to school.

Please be aware that headteachers and staff that they authorise to do so, have a statutory power to search a pupil or their possessions where they have reasonable grounds to suspect that the pupil may have a prohibited item as listed. We will confiscate items that are of high value, deemed inappropriate, are against the school policies or are causing an issue.
